INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

Board of Trustees University of Louisiana at Monroe Foundation

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the University of Louisiana at Monroe Foundation (a nonprofit organization — the Foundation) which comprise the statements of financial position as of June 30, 2015 and 2014, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Foundation as of June 30, 2015 and 2014 and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the years then ended, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Correction of Error

As discussed in Note 12 to the financial statements, certain errors resulting in an understatement of the amounts previously reported for gift annuity liabilities, change in value of split-interest agreements and classification of net assets as of and for the year ended June 30, 2014 were discovered by management of the Foundation during the year ended June 30, 2015. Accordingly, amounts for gift annuity liabilities, change in value of split-interest agreements and classification of net assets have been restated in the 2014 financial statements presented to correct the errors. Our opinion is not modified with respect to these matters.

Other Matters

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The information identified in the accompanying Index as Schedules 1-7 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

The University of Louisiana at Monroe Foundation (the Foundation) is a legally autonomous fund-raising organization that raises funds for the benefit of the University of Louisiana at Monroe (the University), its faculty and its students. Support is received through gifts, grants and bequests, and may include cash, real property and personal property. Funds may be invested by the Foundation in accordance with its investment policy subject to any restrictions imposed by the donor. Disbursements are made for scholarships, academic support and departmental funding. The Foundation has no transactions related to the University's Athletic programs.

The Foundation is a nonprofit corporation exempted from Federal income taxes as "other than a private foundation" under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Foundation has evaluated its position regarding the accounting for uncertain income tax positions and does not believe that it has any material uncertain tax positions. The Foundation is no longer subject to examination by tax authorities for years ended before June 30, 2012.

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and in conformity as required by the *Not-For-Profit Entities* Topic of the Accounting Standards Codification (the Codification).

Financial Statement Classification

Classifications

The net assets of the Foundation are reported as follows:

- 1. Unrestricted includes all resources to be used in support of the Foundation's operations at the sole discretion of the Foundation.
- 2. Temporarily Restricted includes amounts that have been donated for the use of specific University departments, organizations or other beneficiaries. The donations and earnings, if any, are held by the Foundation until requested by the applicable department, organization or beneficiaries and may not be spent at the discretion of the Foundation. Also included are funds to provide interest-free loans to pharmacy students and persons with medical careers.

3. Permanently Restricted - represents amounts contributed to the Foundation that are subject to restrictions imposed by the gift instruments. Contributions to endowment funds are not available for use during the term of the applicable trust agreement. However, the Foundation's investment and spending policies provide for a specified amount of the earnings from such funds to be available for scholarships or for expenses of designated departments of the University as specified by the individual agreements. Unspent earnings are reflected under Temporarily Restricted Net Assets in the Statement of Financial Position and under the Endowment Income column in the Statement of Activities.

Contributions and Promises to Give

In accordance with the Revenue Recognition subtopic of the Not-For-Profit Entities Topic of the Codification, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence or nature of any donor-imposed restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted or temporarily restricted, as appropriate, and reported in the Statement of Activities as net assets released from restrictions. Contributions are recognized as support when received or when an unconditional promise to give is received. However, all contributions received that qualify for matching from the State are recorded as increases in the liability, Funds Held as Agent, and are not reported on the Statement of Activities.

Unconditional promises to give are recognized as revenue in the period received. Promises to give are recorded at their realizable value if they are expected to be collected in one year and at their fair value if they are expected to be collected in more than one year. Conditional promises to give are recognized only when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met and the promises become unconditional. Management has determined that no allowance for doubtful accounts is needed.

Donated Services and Materials

Noncash donations include both materials and services. These donations are recorded at their fair market value on the date of donation. Donated services are recognized only when they create or enhance a nonfinancial asset, or when they are specialized skills provided by entities or persons possessing those skills that would be purchased if they were not donated.

For the year ended June 30, 2015 and 2014, respectively, the Foundation received the following noncash contributions, which enhanced the Foundation as a whole:

Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized between Program and Supporting Services in the Statement of Activities. Program Services expenses are those directly related to the various programs. Supporting Services expenses reflect other expenses incurred in operating the programs.

Property and Equipment

The Foundation capitalizes acquisitions of property and equipment with unrestricted funds in excess of \$1,000 or the fair market value on the date of donation. Costs of property and equipment purchased with unrestricted funds that are less than \$1,000 are charged to expense. The cost of these assets that is classified as program services expense is not capitalized by the Foundation as these assets are owned and used by departments of the University of Louisiana at Monroe. Acquisitions of these assets with restricted private donations are also not capitalized by the Foundation as these assets belong to the State of Louisiana. Capitalized assets are carried at cost or, if donated, at the approximate fair value at the date of donation. Depreciation is recorded on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The Foundation utilizes estimated useful lives of 5 to 7 years for farm equipment and office equipment and 20 years for buildings. Depreciation of \$30,321 and \$38,694 for 2015 and 2014, respectively, was charged to expense.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For Statement of Cash Flows purposes, the Foundation considers all highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

The Foundation, at times, may have deposits in excess of FDIC insured limits. Management, however, believes the credit risk associated with these deposits is minimal.

Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

The unconditional promises to give due in more than one year are reflected at the present value of estimated future cash flows using a discount rate for June 30, 2015 and 2014 of 1% and 5%, respectively. The discount rate has been adjusted in 2015 for the market average.

Note 3 - Land

The Helen Spyker Estate, which consists of farmland, timberland, and oil and gas reserves, is included in unrestricted net assets along with other parcels at June 30, 2015 and 2014 as follows:

Permanently restricted net assets include the Cloverleaf Simmental Farm, which was donated to the Foundation in December 1985. It is reflected in the Statements of Financial Position at its carrying value at \$3,137,317. The Foundation is required to use the majority of the farm acreage for agricultural and educational purposes until December 2015.

Permanently restricted net assets also include a piece of property in Columbia, Louisiana, which was donated to the Foundation in April 2001. It is reflected in the Statements of Financial Position for its appraised value of \$58,000.

Note 4 - Investments

All investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at fair value with gains and losses included in the Statement of Activities. Fair Value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 6 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

The Foundation has adopted investment and spending policies which are reviewed peiodically. Within these policies there exists two distinct portions. The first portion is based upon the Louisiana Board of Regents Endowed Chairs / Endowed Professorship / Endowed Scholarship Programs Statement of Investment Policy and Objectives. This portion limits the equity to no more than 74% of the asset allocation and fixed income to at least 26%. The other limitions include that no more than 10% are in hedge funds, 10% in REITS, and 15% in international investments, which are all part of the equity portion. The second portion is the endowment portion which is based upon a total return philosphy which currently has asset allocation targets of 75% in equites and 25% in fixed income. Within the equity portion the allocation includes 22% in international and 10% in hedge funds.

Return Objectives and Risk Parameters

The Foundation has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment while seeking to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets. Endowment assets include those assets of donor-restricted funds that the Foundation must hold in perpetuity. Under this policy, as approved by the Board of Trustees, the endowment assets are invested in a manner that is intended to produce results that exceed price and yield results of the S&P 500 index while assuming a moderate level of investment risk. The Foundation expects its endowment funds, over time, to provide an average rate of return of approximately 7.5 percent to 8.0 percent annually. Actual returns in any given year may vary from this amount.

Strategies Employed for Achieving Objectives

To satisfy its long-term rate-of-return objectives, the Foundation relies on a total return strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and current yield (interest and dividends).

The Foundation targets a diversified assets allocation that places a greater emphassis on equity-based investments to achieve its long-term return objectives within prudent risk constraints. The Foundation invests in multistrategy hedge funds of funds. The investments are a sophisticated, multimanager program designed to achieve an optimal balance of upside return The investments offer a diversified potential and downside protection. strategy protecting and preserving the Foundation's capital and providing long-term capital growth. This strategy also works to deliver risk-adjusted returns by capturing the market's return potential but with much less volatility. The portfolios are constructed using a time tested, disciplined methodology focused first on risk management. The funds have a demonstrated track record of maintaining a highly disciplined and effective investment allocation decision process. The returns from these hedge funds are reported and posted monthly reflecting the fair market value as of the reporting date.

Spending Policy and How the Investment Objectives Relate to Spending Policy

The Foundation has a policy of appropriating for distribution each year 4 percent of its endowment fund's average fair value over the the prior 5 years through the end of September preceding the fiscal year in which the distribution is planned. In establishing this policy, the Foundation considered the long-term expected return on its endowment. Accordingly, over the long term, the Foundation expects the current spending policy to allow its endowment to grow at the rate of inflation annually. This is consistent with the Foundation's objective to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets held in perpetuity as well as to provide additional real growth through new gifts and investment return.

Note 5 - Fair Value Measurements

The Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure Topic 820, section 50 of the Codification establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820-50 are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
 - Inputs rather than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and,
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2015 and 2014.

<u>Investment Securities</u> — The fair value of investment securities including the Bank Trusts investments is the fair market value based on quoted market prices, where available, or NAV or its equivalent as provided by the administrators of each underlying fund.

Money market/certificate of deposit – The fair value of money market accounts and certificates of deposit are amounts payable on demand at the reporting date. The fair value is based on the present value of each through their respective maturities.

<u>Gift Annuity Liability</u> – The fair value of these agreements is based on the present value of the estimated future payments based upon management's assumptions.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Foundation believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 7 - Gift Annuity Agreements

In October 2005, the Foundation entered into a gift annuity agreement with Paul and Carolyn Lasseigne. As part of the agreement, Mr. and Mrs. Lasseigne gave an irrevocable contribution to the Foundation of \$10,000. Additional contributions can be added to the principal. The Foundation is required to make quarterly payments to them at an annual rate of 5.6% on the cumulative principal balance. These payments will be required for the rest of both of their lives. At the death of both donors, the balance of the annuity corpus will be transferred to the College of Pharmacy Agency fund within the Foundation.

In April 2012, the Foundation entered into a gift annuity agreement with John and Billie Smith. As part of the agreement, Mr. and Mrs. Smith gave an irrevocable contribution to the Foundation of \$250,000. In December 2012, Mr. and Mrs. Smith gave an additional contribution of \$250,000 to the Foundation. Additional contributions can be added to the principal. The Foundation is required to make quarterly payments to them at an annual rate of 5.6% on the cumulative principal balance originally donated in 2012. In December 2014, Mr. and Mrs. Smith gave an additional contribution of \$500,000. The Foundation is required to make quarterly payments to them at an annual rate of 6.1% on the balance of this contribution. These payments will be required for the rest of both of their lives. At the death of both donors, the balance of the annuity corpus will be transferred to the general assets of the Foundation.

In November 2012, the Foundation entered into a gift annuity agreement with Hugh and Kay McDonald. As part of the agreement, Mr. and Mrs. McDonald gave an irrevocable contribution to the Foundation of \$111,775. The Foundation is required to make monthly payments to them at an annual rate of 4.9% on the balance. Additional contributions can be added. In June 2015, Mr. and Mrs. McDonald gave another irrevocable contribution to the Foundation for \$106,720. The Foundation is required to make monthly payments to them at the annual rate of 6.2% on the principal balance. These payments will be required for the rest of both of their lives. At the death of both donors, the balance of the annuity corpus will be transferred to the general assets of the Foundation.

At the end of each fiscal year, the related annuity liability is calculated, and the Foundation adjusts the value accordingly. At June 30, 2015 and 2014, the Foundation included the following as an annuity liability.

During the 1992 regular session of the Louisiana Legislature, R.S.17:3384 and R.S.17:3129.5 were amended and reenacted to enable nonprofit organizations of a type described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code to enter into a contract with a public institution of higher education to act as a depository for Endowed Chairs, Endowed Professorships and Endowed Scholarships derived from state matching funds.

The cumulative original state matching funds as of June 30, 2015 and 2014 are \$5,360,000 and \$5,280,000, respectively and the cumulative total original local matching funds are \$8,040,000 and \$7,920,000, respectively. These cumulative state and local original amounts are included under Funds Held as Agent on the Statements of Financial Position.

For the years ended June 30, 2015 and 2014, the Foundation recognized \$160,000 and \$0, respectively, in state matching funds as temporarily restricted contributions since these were the amounts due from the state for matching funds at the end of each year. When the state matching funds are received, the state funds and the local match funds will be transferred to Funds Held as Agent.

Note 9 - Funds Available

Note 10 - Endowments

Permanently restricted net assets at June 30, 2015 and 2014 consists of endowments established in 1970 to support scholarships and programs at the University of Louisana at Monroe. Contributions to the endowment funds are subject to donor restrictions that stipulate the original gift is to be held and invested by the Foundation indefinitely. Income derived from the fund, as prescribed the investment policy statement, is to be expended as prescribed by the donor.

Funds with Deficiencies

From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor requires the Foundation to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. In accordance with GAAP there were no deficiencies reported for the year ended June 30, 2015 or in 2014.

Note 11 - Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through November 24, 2015, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and have determined that no additional disclosures were necessary.

Note 12 - Prior Period Adjustment

Two gift annuity agreements were entered into in 2012, but were not recorded as such. The gifts were recorded as contributions, which part should have been recorded as an asset, with a liability set up for the future payments owed to the donor. This caused the Gift Annuity Liability to be understated and the revenues to be overstated. A prior period adjustment of \$160,249 was recorded to increase the Gift Annuity Liability to include those above-mentioned gift annuities and to decrease net position for the revenues that were overstated. The prior period adjustment is reported in the Statement of Activities and Changes in Net Assets and Statement of Financial Position.

The 2014 financial statements have been restated due to three gift annuities being incorrectly classified as unrestricted funds in prior years. It was discovered in 2015 that these annuities did have certain restrictions; therefore, they were reclassified appropriately. Although they were originally classified incorrectly, the expenditures were spent in accordance with their contracts.

Verify that the funds for supplemental compensation and/or benefits for a UL System or University employee were paid to the System Office or University for disbursement to the employee; no supplemental payments were made directly to an employee unless specifically approved by the Board Office or University.

No exceptions noted as a result of the above procedure.

Procedure No. 8

Verify that on a quarterly basis the Foundation reported to the University all single payments of \$1,000 or more made to or on behalf of any individual university employee.

Verify a sample of disbursements less than \$1,000 made to or on behalf of University employees has been reviewed for compliance with the policies contained in the Affiliation Agreement, Affiliate Funding and Administration Section 4.

No exceptions noted as a result of the above procedure.

Procedure No. 10

The Foundation has no transactions related to the University's athletic programs and therefore the Foundation's Financial Statements do not include a supplementary schedule for athletic program transactions for the year ended June 30, 2015.

Communication of Material Weakness

University of Louisiana at Monroe Foundation Monroe, Louisiana

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of the University of Louisiana at Monroe Foundation (the Foundation) as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we considered the Foundation's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Foundation's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Foundation's internal control.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses and, therefore, material weaknesses may exist that were not identified. However, as discussed below, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. We consider the following deficiencies in the Foundation's internal control to be material weaknesses:

Non-compliance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles

Condition: Non-compliance with reporting requirements of not-for-profit organizations as specified by Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Section 958 was noted during the audit. The current Foundation staff determined that certain split-interest agreements entered into during prior periods were not recorded properly by the prior Foundation staff. Further, during the audit the auditors determined that current year split-interest agreements were not recorded correctly and that some split-interest agreements were not recorded properly between unrestricted and restricted net assets. Finally, the auditors detected that the Foundation's multi-year pledges were not discounted to present value.

University of Louisiana at Monroe Foundation Monroe, Louisiana Communication of Material Weakness Page 2 of 2

Effect: Prior year financial position and results of operations had to be restated to reflect a decrease in net assets of \$160,000. In addition, current year adjustments were required to decrease contributions and increase the change in value of split-interest agreements by \$248,000, to reduce multi-year pledges receivable to present value by \$100,000.

Cause: The Foundation has increased the size and competency of its staff as recommended in the prior period. The current Foundation staff determined that split-interest agreements were not recorded in the prior period through review of liability accounts as they continued to get the Foundation's books and records in better order. The adjustments to properly record contributions revenue and multi-year pledges appears to be due to a lack of familiarity with the nuances of not-for-profit accounting as required by generally accepted accounting principles.

Criteria: ASC Section 958 requires split-interest agreements to be recorded net of the liability for annuity payments to the donors and that those liabilities be recorded at the receipt of the donation and that promises to give to be received from donors over multiple periods be discounted to present value.

Recommendation: We recommend the Foundation staff continue to develop a deeper understanding of the complexities of not-for-profit accounting and reporting and consult as often as needed with their contract accountants and independent auditors.

Management's Response

The Foundation staff now understands the proper accounting for split-interest agreements and has procedures in place to notify management when these funds are received so that proper recording per ASC Section 958 can take place. Furthermore, the Foundation staff now understands that ASC Section 958 requires that promises to give to be received from donors over multiple periods are to be discounted to present value. Staff now has workpapers in place to accomplish this at future year ends.

Management's written response to the material weakness identified in our audit has not been subjected to the audit procedures applies in the audit of the financial statements and, accordingly, we express no opinion on it.
