Dear Mr. Fleming:

As you are aware, my Investigative Audit staff visited the Twenty-Fifth Judicial Public Defender's Office (District) to assess the validity of certain complaints we received. This letter briefly summarizes the results of our work. We stress the importance of addressing these issues and encourage you to consider our recommendations as you work to resolve the following:

Unauthorized Student Loan Assistance Payments

Records show that former District Defender Chanel Long entered into several contracts for Public Defender Services with the Louisiana Public Defender Board (Board) to serve as the District Defender for the District. Each of the contracts that we reviewed¹ sets Ms. Long's compensation and provides that the Board, "...has the sole authority, but not obligation, to increase the salary and/or other compensation payable to the District Defender.... District Defender shall not use funds from any source to supplement his or her Board-approved salary." The contracts also authorized Ms. Long to use District funds to provide two benefits to District personnel: the payment of the employer's portion of public retirement and health insurance premiums. The contracts further stated that the "District Defender is not and will not be entitled to any of the benefits which the LPDB makes or may make available to its employees...."²

According to District records, Ms. Long authorized student loan assistance payments, totaling \$15,619, to herself and three District employees from May 13, 2022 to June 30, 2022. These payments were included on regular payroll checks and categorized as "tuition assistance." Ms. Long told us the District is one of the hardest to recruit for and, as such, she developed the student loan assistance benefit to retain and attract staff. Ms. Long stated that the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act gave her authorization to issue the student loan assistance payments and provided a copy of the District's student loan

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assistance policy, titled "Plaquemines Parish Public Defender Employer Paid Student Loan Assistance Policy." This policy, which appears to have been approved by Ms. Long on May 11, 2022, states:

Pursuant to 26 U.S. Code Sec. 127, Plaquemines Parish Public Defender will pay up to \$5,200 in student loan repayment assistance. The payment is not income, it is a benefit. All payments shall be made yearly. The employee must be on staff on May 15 of each calendar year and employed with the office for at least 90 days in order to qualify for the payment. The employee must provide a forecast or estimate of student loan payments. Plaquemines Parish Public Defender agrees to pay for 12 payments and in no event more than \$5,200. Payment will be made directly to the employee. The employee is responsible for making said payments to his/her student loan provider.

Although Internal Revenue Code Section 127 may exclude student loan repayments from the recipient employee's gross income, neither that law nor Ms. Long's contract with LPDB authorized her to make those payments. Moreover, she did not seek approval from the Board to modify her contract or make those payments. Rather, Ms. Long's contract for Public Defender Services only authorized her to provide District employees with the employer's portion of public retirement and health insurance premiums. In addition, Ms. Long's contracts provided that she shall not use funds from any source to supplement her Board-approved salary and that she was not entitled to any benefits that the Board makes available to District employees. By authorizing student loan assistance payments to herself and district employees, Ms. Long may have violated her contract with the Board, state law³, and the Louisiana Constitution⁴.

³ Louisiana Revised Statute (La. R.S.) 42:1461(A) states, "Officials, whether elected or appointed and whether compensated or not, and employees of any "public entity", which, for purposes of this Section shall mean and include any department, division, office, board, agency, commission, or other organizational unit of any of the three branches of state government or of any parish, municipality, school board or district, court of limited jurisdiction, or other political subdivision or district, or the office of any sheriff, district attorney, coroner, or clerk of court, by the act of accepting such office or employment assume a personal obligation not to misappropriate, misapply, convert, misuse, or otherwise wrongfully take any funds, property, or other thing of value belonging to or under the custody or control of the public entity in which they hold office or are employed."

La. R.S. 42:1111(A) states, "Payments for services to the governmental entity. (1)(a) No public servant shall receive anything of economic value, other than compensation and benefits from the governmental entity to which he is duly entitled, for the performance of the duties and responsibilities of his office or position."

⁴ Louisiana Constitution Article VII, Section 14(A) provides, in part, "Prohibited Uses. Except as otherwise provided by this constitution, the funds, credit, property, or things of value of the state or of any political subdivision shall not be loaned, pledged, or donated to or for any person, association, or corporation, public or private."

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Recommendations

We recommend that the District consult with legal counsel to determine the appropriate actions to be taken, including recovering funds related to student loan assistance payments to Ms. Long and other District employees. We further recommend that the District provide employee benefits, pending available funds, as established by the contract between the Board and the District Defender.

This correspondence represents our findings and recommendations, as well as management's response. This correspondence is intended primarily for the information and use of management of the Twenty-Fifth Judicial District of the Public Defender's Office.
