Management has elected to omit certain required supplementary information, such as management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information, that the Governmental Accounting Standards Board requires to be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such missing information, although not a required part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, which considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting and for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context.

Supplementary Information

The schedule of compensation, benefits, and other payments to agency head on page 15 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. This information is the representation of management. The information was subject to our compilation engagement; however, we have not audited or reviewed the supplementary information and, accordingly, do not express an opinion, a conclusion, nor provide any form of assurance on such supplementary information.

SCHEDULE OF PRIOR YEAR FINDINGS

Year Ended December 31, 2024

The following finding was noted in the accountant's compilation report dated August 22, 2024, for the year ended December 31, 2023.

Finding No. 2023-001 - Report Submission

The District did not submit compiled financial statements to the Louisiana Legislative Auditor within the period prescribed by applicable regulations. The District engaged the services of an accounting in a timely manner, but accounting records and other supporting documentation were not provided to the accountant in sufficient time to complete the compilation engagement prior to the statutory deadline. The District is responsible for compliance with financial statement reporting requirements and was not in compliance with those requirements until the submission of the 2023 financial statements was made. It was recommended that the District engage its outside accounting firm and provide necessary information to that firm in a timely manner to ensure future financial statements are submitted to the Louisiana Legislative Auditor. No similar finding was noted in the current audit period (see Schedule of Findings).
