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Why We Conducted This Audit

We performed certain procedures at the Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC) as a part of the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report of the State of Louisiana, the Single Audit of the State of Louisiana, and to evaluate LWC's accountability over public funds for the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022.

What We Found

In state fiscal year 2022, LWC resolved prior-year findings related to Noncompliance with Requirements for the Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment Program, Inadequate Controls over Interstate Billing and Employer Charging Requirements, Noncompliance with Reporting Requirements for The Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act, and Unexecuted Source Code Escrow Agreement.

Two findings from the prior year are repeated in this report:

- Inadequate Controls over and Noncompliance with Unemployment Insurance Benefits Requirements – For the third consecutive year, LWC did not have adequate internal controls and did not comply with requirements of the Unemployment Insurance federal program.
- Inadequate Controls over and Noncompliance with Subrecipient Monitoring Requirements – For the fourth consecutive year, LWC did not adequately follow-up on subrecipient monitoring reports under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Cluster programs.
