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SUMMARY OF SEMIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Upper Delta Soil and Water Conservation District was created by the Louisianz. The Lopisitizen. A. FUND ACCOUNTING

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are presented as if the accounts were organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which would be considered a separate accounting cells. Since the District has no financial resources which are required to b accounted for in other hands, only a perhall coveraint hand was used.

B ENED ASSETS

in the General Fixed Assets account group, rather than the Governmental Fund. No depreciation has been provided on general fixed assets. All fixed assets are valued at historical cost.

This account group is not a "fund." It is concerned with the measurement of financial position, not with measurement of operations.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenditures are recognized and apported in the financial statements. Basis of ecounting mission between timing of the resourcement made, regardates of the measurement focus applied. The records are martislated on a cash basis and the accompanying financial statements have been converted to a modified accrual basis of accounting using the following practices:

D. BUDGETARY PRACTICES

A budget was submitted to the Office of Soil and Water Conservation, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Foresty. State Funding for the year was based upon the advocation procedures established in the program rules and regulations.

E. ANNUAL AND SICK LEAVE

Employees earn and accumulate annual and sick leave at various rates depending on their years of service. Unused annual and aick leave socuralistes without limit. The number of hours of unused annual leave for which an employee may receive a lump sum payment upon termination from District employment may not exceed 300 hours.

At June 30, 1997 (fiscal dose), the Upper Delta Soil and Water Conservation District had accumulated and vested \$3, 610.47 in leave privileges, required to be accorded under SFAS 41. Current year expenditures for salary and leave privileges total \$32, 212.35.
