As required by Louisiana Revised Statute 24:513, we conducted certain procedures at the Military Department. Our procedures included (1) a review of the department's internal control; (2) tests of financial transactions for the period from July 1, 2002, through March 30, 2004; and (3) tests of adherence to applicable laws, regulations, policies, and procedures governing financial activities for the period from July 1, 2002, through March 30, 2004. Our procedures were more limited than would be necessary to give an opinion on internal control and on compliance with laws, regulations, policies, and procedures governing financial, and procedures governing financial activities.

Specifically, we interviewed management personnel and selected departmental personnel and evaluated selected documents, files, reports, systems, procedures, and policies, as we considered necessary.

The Annual Fiscal Reports of the Military Department were not audited or reviewed by us, and, accordingly, we do not express an opinion on these reports. The department's accounts are an integral part of the State of Louisiana's financial statements, upon which the Louisiana Legislative Auditor expresses opinions.

Based on the application of the procedures referred to previously, we found no matters that required disclosure in this report. However, a report was issued as described below, on the Louisiana Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness, an agency within the Military Department, which included a finding.

#### OTHER REPORT

On March 3, 2004, a report was issued on the Louisiana Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness by the Louisiana Legislative Auditor's Fraud and Abuse Audit Division. The report included a finding that the Louisiana Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness failed to adequately monitor sub-grantee expenditures relating to the Flood Mitigation Assistance and Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.
